Dear Music Teachers,

Welcome to the Vocal and Instrumental Eisteddfod for 2022!

This year, we have formed a Committee in lieu of a single Festival Director, which is designed to help share the load of the administrative work behind the scenes as well as the day-to-day running of this massive Festival. Together, we have made several changes to the syllabus based on feedback from various music teachers, and also discussions with Paul Colman, our adjudicator for 2020 and 2021.

We plan on proceeding with a physical Festival in 2022, but this is COVID dependent and may not include the larger groups. We will advise the music teachers as soon as we know what our host venues and the government intends on doing in the new year, but please also be prepared for unexpected changes that may be out of our control.

We have a new and exciting challenge for the choirs in the 2022 Festival – a Choral Challenge. This will be an online venture that will be open to 1 choir per school that received Honours for their performance. Please see the syllabus for more details on the Choral Challenge Cups.
